- **Treasurer's Report: Mary Jane Barretta**

Fundraising Efforts as of February 4, 2021:

Agnes Higgins Memorial Scholarship Fund	\$ 8,715.00 (restricted/in separate account)
Operation Chill Out	\$ 1,210.00 (restricted, Special State Project)
Cook Book	\$ 1,210.00 (restricted, Cookbook fundraiser)
Membership Contributions in lieu of fall fundraiser	\$ 2,185.00 (unrestricted)
Friends of the Woman's Club of Brielle	\$ 10,600.00 (restricted, charitable contributions/scholarships)

Actions to be taken:

Motion #1: That \$1306.00 of the funds in the Raffle Account be moved to the checking account and used for contributions to charities and other 501(c)(3) organizations and scholarships. This would leave a balance of \$1,000 in the Raffle Fund as is required and bring the total currently available for charitable giving and scholarships to \$11,906 (\$10,600 from the Friends of the Woman's Club of Brielle and \$1,306.00 from the Raffle Account).

Motion #2: That the Woman's Club of Brielle expend a total of \$10,349 for charitable giving for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, as per the proposed budget indicated below.

Budget for Scholarships

The above information confirms that we now have enough money for 3 *Scholarships* (\$1,000 from the Agnes Higgins Memorial Scholarship Fund and \$2,000 contributed by the Friends of the Brielle Woman's Club and donations Club members have made in lieu of participating in the usual fall fundraiser). Since we are still working on fund raising projects and do not yet know how much more money we will have for scholarships, a proposal for scholarships to be given in 2021 will be made to the Club members at the March meeting.
